New solar-powered EV truck Charge and Change Station

This month we welcomed NSW Minister for Transport, Jo Haylen, to the launch of Janus Electric's latest Charge and Change Station for electric heavy vehicles at Moorebank Intermodal Precinct.

These pioneering battery-swapping stations, powered entirely by rooftop solar, mark a significant step in transforming Australia's heavy vehicle transport sector. The quick swap takes just a few minutes, about the same amount of time as refuelling. It's the first facility of its kind to be built at an Australian intermodal terminal where freight is moved between road and rail.

This milestone reflects our wider commitment cut down greenhouse gas emissions and help to set a new standard in sustainable freight transport.







Tree planting ceremony kicks off revegetation initiative

In November, Moorebank Intermodal Precinct held a tree-planting ceremony in the former "Dustbowl" area, once a military training ground near the Georges River. This site has now been rehabilitated and will be replanted to become a vibrant biodiversity zone.

This initiative is part of our broader commitment to rehabilitate and protect approximately 100 hectares of bushland—three times the size of Sydney's Botanical Gardens—ensuring a flourishing habitat for native species, and supporting a resilient ecosystem for future generations.



Update: Moorebank Avenue Realignment

From January 2025, the primary construction works will commence for the planned realignment and upgrade of Moorebank Avenue to streamline traffic management in the local area and improve road safety.

Works are scheduled to commence from mid-January 2025 and will be on-going for approximately 18 months. The works will deliver a four-lane, three-kilometre road realignment connecting the north and south of the Precinct.

The construction works for this project would be predominately undertaken offline, with only short periods of changes to road conditions along Moorebank Avenue. Unless otherwise advised, most works will take place within the Precinct's approved standard construction hours of Monday to Friday 7am – 6pm and Saturday 8am – 1pm.
