



Moorebank Intermodal Precinct (MIP) is one of Australia's most significant industrial hubs, set to transform national supply chains by shifting freight from road to rail, reducing costs, cutting emissions, and improving delivery efficiency.

Project Update: Moorebank Avenue Realignment

Works on the Moorebank Avenue Realignment continue to progress strongly. Over the past quarter, significant milestones have been achieved, including substantial progress on the Department of Defence JLU entry works and completion of the ANZAC Creek culvert. The upgraded culvert will support effective drainage while maintaining a dedicated passage for local wildlife.

Shortly, residents can expect to see pavement works commence which will include kerbs, concrete paving and road asphalt works, bringing us closer to delivering the upgraded Moorebank Avenue for the community and the precinct.

Once complete, the Moorebank Avenue Realignment will improve safety and create a more efficient road network for motorists, cyclists and pedestrians. Most construction will take place away from the existing Moorebank Avenue, helping minimise impacts to road users.

New milestones achieved at Kmart Moorebank Omnichannel Fulfillment Centre



Works on the Kmart Moorebank Omnichannel Fulfillment Centre have progressed across multiple areas, with high-level services installation ongoing throughout the warehouse. Internal and external concrete slab preparation and pours are continuing, supporting steady progress across both building and external pavement works. Bushmaster Avenue civil works are also underway, including service installation and kerb construction.

Within the buildings, several internal works are advancing. Dock office sheeting has commenced, while inbound dock office sheeting is in progress. The main office Level 1 amenities tiling has now been completed along with the control tower ground floor sheeting. Workshop office rough-in works are ongoing, alongside the installation of carpark kerbs and sprinkler tanks.

Looking ahead, works will continue on internal and external slab pours, along with progression of warehouse high-level services. Upcoming activities ahead of the targeted Q3 site completion include main office service tiling and floor finishes, gatehouse service rough-ins, and start of joinery installation.

Moorebank Eco-Tours: Bringing Biodiversity Learning to Life

The Moorebank Intermodal Precinct is pleased to share the continued growth of its Eco-Tour program, which is helping connect the local community with the important biodiversity values found across the precinct and surrounding conservation areas.

Since launching in late 2024, the guided Eco-Tours have provided schools, community groups, council representatives and local stakeholders with opportunities to explore conservation areas in a safe, low-impact and engaging way.

In early 2026, the precinct partnered with Wattle Grove Public School to pilot a “Reverse Eco-Tour”, bringing ecologists into the school grounds to support practical environmental learning. Students took part in birdwatching, nest box inspections and habitat activities while learning about native species, healthy ecosystems, weeds and habitat connections.

Liverpool City Council representatives and community stakeholders have also participated in Eco-Tours at Moorebank, providing an opportunity to share conservation progress and strengthen local partnerships. Night Eco-Tours with the Wattle Grove Scouts have offered another valuable perspective, highlighting nocturnal wildlife and the role conservation areas play after dark.

The Moorebank Intermodal Precinct looks forward to continuing its work with schools, community groups and local partners to support biodiversity awareness and conservation outcomes.



Creating New Habitat in the Disused Rail Spur

At Moorebank, National Intermodal and ESR are creating new biodiversity habitat within a former Defence disused rail spur, supporting the *Hibbertia fumana* translocation program and the precinct's broader conservation values. *Hibbertia Fumana* is a low, yellow-flowering shrub - delicate, resilient, and uniquely Australian which was once thought to be extinct before a small population was rediscovered within the adjoining bushland in the late 2010s.

To rehabilitate and revegetate the disused rail spur, 668 tonnes of topsoil containing native seedbank material has been salvaged and reused, along with 185 tonnes of mulch from the Moorebank Avenue Realignment project and 8.4 kilograms of native seed spread across 6,000 square metres.

Regrowth is already visible in the area as native seed responds and vegetation begins returning. Subject to agreement with the Biodiversity Conservation Trust, this area will be incorporated into the Moorebank Biodiversity Offset sites to support the long-term conservation of this habitat and its important native species.

Through continued collaboration, the project is helping restore disturbed land, improve ecological connections and support the long-term conservation of one of Moorebank's most distinctive local plant species.



Operation and Construction Hours

The approved operating hours of the Intermodal Facility (including the Import Export Terminal, Rail Link and Warehousing) are 24 hours, 7 days a week.

Out-of-Hours Work

Our works are generally carried out within standard construction hours, however there may be certain activities or unavoidable circumstances which will require out-of-hours work to minimise the impact to the community, road users and local businesses.

These works will be communicated in advance on the MIP website and via a letterbox drop to the impacted residents and businesses.
